
To rehearse sentences for an audio news broadcast

Journalists have to prepare their own scripts before they make an audio broadcast. Saying their writing out loud helps them to check if what they are saying is easy for their audience to understand.

While we listen to the news broadcast again, think about:


- When did you hear the 5Ws?

Thinking about the 5Ws

When writing a script it can be tempting to work on the top line first of all.

It is actually a good idea to think about the 5Ws before this. (These are the most important facts that the audience needs to know.)

Astronauts had no idea how it went missing, but the mystery of the lost tomato has now been solved.

The top line says what the story is about without giving all of the details away. It makes the audience want to hear more.
