

Death trap scooters banned from Paris streets

The people of Paris are fed up with the scooters which will soon be gone.

Electric scooters that have caused injuries and deaths will be banned in Paris after a public vote yesterday.

Anne Hidalgo, the mayor of Paris, decided to ask the city what they thought of the dangerous vehicles. A vote was held, and people waited in long queues to have their say.

The results were clear, and nine out of ten people in the city wanted to see the high-risk scooters banned.

People have been upset with the scooters since they first appeared in the city. In 2022, over 400 people were injured by them. They have also been driven dangerously by young people and dumped in the river.

Suzon Lambert, a teacher in Paris, is glad that they have been banned. She told reporters that, "Scooters have become my biggest enemy. I'm scared of them."

The whole city will be delighted that the electric monstrosities will be gone soon. The city has spoken, and the scooters are finished.
